Witchelina Nature Reserve is a 421,000ha property located on Adnyamathanha and Arabana countries, near Maree. It is a vital part of the North-South Eco-link which starts at Port Augusta and extends through the Northern Territory into Arnhem Land.

Hiltaba Nature Reserve is a 78,000ha property located on Bungala, Kokatha and Wirangu countries in the Gawler Ranges on the Eyre Peninsula, and is part of the East meets West Naturelink corridor.
